Against the G8 2008 London Solidarity Protests

The G8 Summit 2008 took place in Hokkaido, Japan, from July 7th to 9th. As always, people across the world were protesting this summit and the capitalist system it represents.

Saturday the 5th of July, International Day of Action Against the G8, there were protests worldwide, and in London there was a picket outside the Japanese embassy on Friday and Saturday. And despite previous harassment by the Metropolitan police, a London Fete Against the G8 was called by London No Borders and other groups to demonstrate in solidarity, for the Freedom of Movement, and against Fortress Europe. The day of action around the UK Borders Agency started with a Critical Mass bike ride from Brixton to Croydon, the nerve centre of the Home Office's UK Border Agency, where several protests unfolded.

The demonstration demanded an end to the borders policies dictated and carried out specially by the richest countries in the world (namely the G8 and others) and freedom to protest without the insane harassment the police, especially "teams" like FIT, inflict on rightful protesters.

A daily NO!G8 cafe in London has been organised to coincide with the G8 mobilisations at the Bowl Court Social Centre, with films, discussions and screenings of footage from Japan. Monday was a day of info and report on the International Day of Action Against the G8; Tuesday, a discussion on the problems experienced by activists when entering Japan and other repression leading up to the G8. Wednesday, screening of 'What Would it Mean to Win?' including footage from Heiligendamm during the G8 last year.

London Critical Mass

June's Critical mass saw a slightly different route. As always we met at Southbank and managed to lave 7.15pm. Following the killing of Marie Vesco on the A23 her friends, rampART and Food Not Bombs asked people to ride to Brixton, where she served free food every Sunday afternoon with Brixton Food Not Bombs.

Approximately 600 cyclists left Waterloo going South via Lambeth North, then Elephant& Castle, going round a few times stopping the traffic, via the Oval to Brixton.

The cycle police keep on targeting Critical Mass sound systems in the SOCPA zone around Parliament while doing nothing to stop sound systems in cars, buses and lorries. Also the SOCPA legislation is currently under review and other police are tending not to enforce it.

There is also now a new southeast London Critical Mass: first Friday of every month, meet 6.30pm outside Peckham Library.

People are asked to join the Tent City Occupation or just visit, help build networks, share information and knowledge on non-violent-direct-action, and help with non-violent-direct-action to halt the project.

Wimbledon Southfields Total Oil Burma Protests

On 25th June and 2nd July the totaloutofburma.org team held a protest at Southfields Total Oil Station, 262 Wimbledon Park Road, London SW19 6NL. They leafleted the pedestrians attending the Wimbledon Tennis Tournament just down the road from the station. French Total Oil funds the brutal Burma junta with 500 million dollars a year and its gas pipeline in Burma was built with slave labour.

Over the 2 protests they were able to distribute about 1,000 leaflets to the crowds attending Wimbledon, including many taxis. Some cars did turn away from the Total station and people were shocked to learn of Total's involvement in Burma.

The last Londoner in Guantánamo Bay turns 30 on 24/7 - after six years of illegal detention, he is suicidal and on hunger strike and facing the prospect of an unfair trial and the death penalty. In the run up to his 30th birthday, take action to get the British government to stop his trial and have him returned to this country.

"In the run up to the 24/7 demonstration, the LGC has been given permission by the police to hold a 24 hour a day demonstration for 7 days outside the US Embassy from Friday 18 July to Thursday 24 July. If Binyam can send six years in illegal detention, we can spend one week outside the US Embassy asking the Americans to drop the charges and close the kangaroo court."
