Safety on Critical Mass. Staying together:

The slowest sets the pace !!!

..this will keep us as a mass and discourage cars from getting between us. The front must pay attention to the back and vise versa....it's everyone's responsibility to communicate..

"too slow, too fast, one lane, two lanes, let the bus pass by, slow down...."



Don't spread to thin:

It's not safe to take over two lanes if we are less than twenty bikes, we are no longer seen as a mass
