# SENDING BOOKS TO THE INCARCERATED

Some organizations stopped accepting donations during the COVID-19 pandemic. Be sure to confirm that a location is currently accepting donations before sending books, and that the books you'd like to send are in demand. Prison policies vary by location and can play a major role in determining which books can be sent to people inside. If you have questions, be sure to reach out before donating. Always review a specific organizations guidelines and requests before sending any material.

### **DO SEND:**

Paperbacks & recently published books - Black, Latinx, Queer History -How-to & Self-Help books - Dictionaries, GED/HSE, test prep, study guides, language studies - unused Soduko/puzzles - Guides for starting businesses - Yoga & exercise books - Mysteries, thrillers, sci-fi, fantasy, urban fiction - Comics & graphic novels, fiction & non-fiction in Spanish

Books with spiral bindings - Hard cover books - Textbooks more than 5 years old - Religious pamphlets - Magazines older than the current year - Books in bad condition - Books with highlighting or notes - Anything banned by the prison
